Uppsala University, founded in 1477, is the oldest university in the Nordic countries.

The University has three disciplinary domains: Arts and Social Sciences, Medicine and Pharmacy, and Science and Technology. Education and research are conducted in nine faculties: theology, law, arts, languages, social sciences, educational sciences, medicine, pharmacy, science and technology. The number of employees is around 6,000. During the years Uppsala University has had seven Nobel Prize laureates.

For students Uppsala University offers 60 programs for beginners, 50 master programs, and some 2,000 single-subject courses. Every year 40,000 undergraduate and graduate students enroll for different courses and some 4,500 undergraduate and graduate degrees are conferred.

Postgraduate education includes 2,300 doctoral students (50% women). About 300 doctorates and about 80 licentiate degrees are conferred each year. About 50% of research is funded by external sources.

Uppsala University has agreements for student exchange with 500 foreign universities in 50 countries
